Instructions:

- Choose **one book** to read over the summer
- Read the book in its entirety.
- Complete **two reading response questions** below in **1 well-developed paragraph each**.

Reading Response Questions:

1. **Theme:** What is a central theme of the book? How does the author develop this theme throughout the story?
2. **Character Development:** Choose a main character. How does this character grow or change over the course of the text? What causes this change?
3. **Author's Craft:** Describe a part of the book that stood out to you. What literary devices or writing techniques did the author use to make that moment powerful?
4. **Personal Connection:** Make a text-to-self or text-to-world connection. How did this book connect to your life or to something happening in the world today?

Part 2: Creative Writing Challenge

Instructions:

Choose **one** of the prompts below and write a short story or narrative response (**1.5–2 pages typed or neatly written**). Use descriptive language, dialogue, and clear organization (beginning, middle, end).

Prompts:

- Imagine waking up in a world where books are banned. What happens next?
- Write a story about someone who receives a letter from their future self.
- Create a fictional story based on a true event in your life.
